

AN ORDINANCE FIXING COMPENSATION, SALARIES AND THE BONDS OF BOROUGH OFFICIALS, AND PROVIDING FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE PREMIUMS FOR SAID BONDS, AND DIRECTING THE TAX COLLECTOR TO BE THE DELINQUENT TAX COLLECTOR.

The Council of the Borough of Monroeville hereby enacts as follows:

ARTICLE I. Section 1. The Tax Collector of the Borough is hereby designated and appointed to be the Collector of Delinquent Taxes for the Borough.

Section 2. The Compensation of Tax

Collector shall be and he shall receive a commission of 3% of all Borough taxes he collects at discounted or face amounts, and 5% commission of all delinquent Borough taxes he collects with penalties, from such taxes as are assessed against and collected from or in behalf of taxpayers of the Borough, and any other or additional compensation as shall be fixed or allowed by the Court of Quarter Sessions of Allegheny County; said commissions are to be charged against the taxes collected and shall be indicated in the Collector's statements and reports made and filed, and are to be paid by the Borough.

ARTICLE II

Section 1. The Office of Borough Secretary is hereby created in conformance with the resolution of Council heretofore enacted, and the compensation or salary of the Secretary, for all services rendered, shall be and he or she shall receive the sum of One Hundred Fifty (\$150.00) Dollars per month, payable monthly, beginning with January, 1952. The said Secretary shall provide and furnish a bond as herein-after set forth.

ARTICLE III

Section 1. The Office of Borough Solicitor is hereby created in conformance with the resolution of Council heretofore enacted, and the compensation of the Solicitor shall be and he shall receive the sum of Nine Hundred (\$900.00) Dollars per year, beginning January, 1952, payable in quarterly payments of Two Hundred Twenty-Five (\$225.00) Dollars, in March, June, September and December of each year, which compensation shall be as a retainer fee for his services in furnishing opinions and

advice to the Borough Officials and for attending regular meetings of Council. The Solicitor shall be paid additional reasonable compensation for preparation of ordinances, resolutions, contracts, agreements, leases or other legislative action or legal action pertaining to Borough business, liens, improvements and claims, eminent domain or condemnation proceedings, filing or defending suits or legal actions by or against the Borough, matters involving bonded indebtedness, or for the performance of any other special services.

ARTICLE IV

Section 1. The Office of Borough Treasurer is hereby created, in conformance with the resolution of Council heretofore enacted. No salary or compensation is to be paid to such person or bank acting as Borough Treasurer, however such Treasurer shall provide and furnish security bond, as hereinafter directed.

ARTICLE V

Section 1. The bonds required of the various elective and appointed officers of the Borough, as hereinafter set forth, or as shall hereafter be fixed and designated by Council, shall be given by the respective officer and endorsed by a surety or approved bonding company, in the amount or sum stated or designated, as security for their faithful performance of their duties; the said bonds to be to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, for the use and benefit of the Borough of Monroeville.

(a) The Tax Collector shall be required to furnish a bond, in such amount as is required by law, however, not to exceed 1/3 of the total amount as shown by the tax duplicate book, and to be approved by the Court of Quarter Sessions of Allegheny County. In addition, the said Tax Collector, as Delinquent Tax Collector, shall be required, annually, to furnish a security bond, endorsed by a surety or approved bonding company, in the amount of Two Thousand (\$2,000.00) Dollars to and for the use and benefit of the Borough of Monroeville.

(b) The Secretary shall be required to furnish a bond, annually, in the sum of Two Thousand (\$2,000.00) Dollars.

(c) The Treasurer shall be required to furnish a bond, annually, in the sum of Six Thousand (\$6,000.00) Dollars.

(d) Any other officer, appointee or employee, who shall be employed by the Borough, may be required by Council, to furnish a security bond to and for the use, benefit and protection of the Borough, for the faithful performance of their duties, in such amount and upon such terms and conditions as Council may direct.

Section 2. The Borough shall pay the premium on all bonds required of and given by the Tax Collector, Secretary, Treasurer, and all other officers, appointees or employees, employed by the Borough and from whom bonds are required by Council.
