

The Council of the Borough of Monroeville hereby enacts as follows:

AN ORDINANCE TO PRESERVE THE PEACE AND GOOD ORDER OF THE BOROUGH OF MONROEVILLE, BY PROHIBITING DRUNKENNESS, VAGRANCY, SUSPICIOUS CHARACTERS, DISORDERLY CONDUCT, RESISTING OFFICERS, PUBLIC LEWDNESS, DISORDERLY HOUSES AND VISITING THE SAME, MALICIOUS MISCHIEF, DESTROYING PUBLIC PROPERTY AND SPITTING UPON THE SIDEWALKS AND CROSSING WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE BOROUGH OF MONROEVILLE, DESCRIBING AND DEFINING SAID OFFENSES, PROHIBITING THE SAME, AND PROVIDING FINES AND PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person while intoxicated to be upon any street, lane, alley, avenue, road or highway or other public place within the limits of the Borough of Monroeville, to the annoyance of any of the inhabitants thereof, or to annoy any of the residents of the Borough by trespassing on any private property; to commit any act of open lewdness or public indecency or exposure of person; or to assemble with others on the public street, lanes alleys, avenues, roads, highways, sidewalks, public places or elsewhere within the limits of the Borough in such manner as to interfere with, impede or annoy the traveling public; and any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this section, upon conviction before the Burgess or any Justice of the Peace of the Borough, in summary proceeding, shall be subject to and pay a fine of not more than Twenty-Five (\$25.00) Dollars, together with costs of prosecution, and in default thereof, the person so convicted shall be committed to the County Jail for a period not to exceed thirty (30) days.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person who shall have no fixed place of residence, to go about from house to house, or from place to place within the limits of the Borough of Monroeville, begging or asking for food, alms or other valuable things, as means of sustenance, or for any person who is without visible means of support, or is unable to account for his actions to the satisfaction of the arresting officer, to trespass upon private property or elsewhere within the limits of the Borough of Monroeville, and any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this section, upon conviction before the Burgess or any Justice of the Peace of the Borough, in summary proceeding,

shall be subject to and pay a fine of not more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, together with the costs of prosecution, and in default thereof, the person so convicted shall be committed to the County Jail for a period not to exceed thirty days.

Section 3. It shall be unlawful for any person to loaf, loiter or stand upon any of the sidewalks or other public highways or places, so as to interfere with the free and full passage of residents or travelers, or to wilfully make any loud, boisterous, profane, indecent, immoral utterances or unseemly noise or disturbance or to fight or publicly threaten or challenge any person or persons, or cause the assemblage of persons upon or near any street, lane, alley, avenue, road, park or highway or public place, within the limits of the Borough, in any manner so as to annoy or disturb residents of the Borough, or by any disturbance or breach of the peace or disorderly conduct, or to engage in fighting or to incite others to fight or to engage in any unlawful act tending to imperil the personal security or to endanger or injure property within the Borough. Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this section shall, upon conviction thereof before the Burgess or any Justice of the Peace of the Borough, in summary proceeding, be subject to and pay a fine of not more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, together with the costs of prosecution, and in default thereof, the person so convicted shall be committed to the County Jail for a period not to exceed thirty (30) days.

Section 4. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons, other than property constituted peace officers, to display, possess or make use of knife, handy billy, artificial knuckles, club, gun, revolver, or discharge same upon any of the streets, alley, roads, lanes, highways or elsewhere within the limits of the Borough, and any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this section shall, upon conviction thereof, before the Burgess or any Justice of the Peace of the Borough, in summary proceeding, be subject to and pay a fine of not more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars together with the costs of prosecution,

and in default thereof, the person or persons so convicted shall be committed to the County Jail for a period not to exceed thirty days.

Section 5. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to resist an officer in the performance of his duty or to aid, encourage or abet any other person or persons to resist such officer within the limits of the Borough, and any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this section shall, upon conviction thereof before the Burgess or any Justice of the Peace of the Borough, in summary proceeding, be subject to and pay a fine of not more than Twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars, together with the costs of prosecution, and in default thereof, the person or persons so convicted shall be committed to the County Jail for a period not to exceed thirty days.

Section 6. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to set up, open, maintain or conduct any gambling place or device, immoral show, entertainment or exhibition, unlawful drinking place or resort for dispensing of liquor or house of prostitution, or to be gathered in or participate in the operation of the same, or to be a patron thereof. Any person who shall be guilty of maintaining or conducting a house of bad repute, or a disorderly house, or place for the encouragement of idleness, gambling, unlawful drinking or other misbehaviour, or to the disturbance of the residents of the Borough, or any person who shall visit or frequent any such place or premises within the limits of the Borough, shall, upon conviction thereof before the Burgess or any Justice of the Peace of the Borough, in summary proceeding, be subject to and pay a fine of not more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, together with the costs of prosecution, and in default thereof, the person or persons so convicted, shall be committed to the County Jail for a period of not more than thirty (30) days.

Section 7. Any person who shall wilfully and maliciously deface or injure any tree, shrub, bush or vine, on or along any street, highway or elsewhere within the limits of the Borough, shall, upon conviction thereof before the Burgess or any Justice of the Peace of the Borough, in summary proceeding, be subject to

and pay a fine of not more than One Hundred(\$100.00) Dollars, together with costs of prosecution, and default thereof, the persons so convicted shall be committed to the County Jail for a period not to exceed thirty days.

Section 8. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to expectorate upon any of the boardwalks, sidewalks or crossings within the limits of the Borough, and any person or persons so doing shall, upon conviction thereof, before the Burgess or any Justice of the Peace of the Borough, in summary proceeding, be subject to and pay a fine of not more than Ten (\$100.00) Dollars, together with costs of prosecution, and in default thereof, the person so convicted shall be committed to the County jail for a period not to exceed thirty days.

Section 9. It shall be the duty of the policemen, constables and other peace officers of the Borough to arrest upon view and without warrant to commit for a hearing, any and all persons, violating the provisions of this ordinance, who shall fail or refuse to give bail or make satisfactory deposit for his, her or their appearance for trial in accordance with the practices of summary conviction.

When any person is arrested upon view, a complaint on oath or affirmation shall be immediately made, whereupon the same proceedings shall be had as upon a warrant issued.

Section 10. The sections of this Ordinance shall be severable and should any section or provision of this Ordinance be declared by the Courts to be invalid, the same shall not effect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any part thereof other than the part so declared to be invalid.

Section 11. All ordinances or parts of ordinances conflicting herewith are hereby repealed insofar as they affect this ordinance.
