

ORDINANCE NO. 12

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF MONROEVILLE REGULATING THE SPEED OF VEHICLES UPON ALL ROADS, STREETS, AVENUES AND THOROUGHFARES OF THE BOROUGH AND REGULATING AND LIMITING THE WEIGHT OF MOTOR VEHICLES TRAVELING OVER AND UPON THE ROADS, STREETS, AVENUES, AND THOROUGHFARES OF THE BOROUGH, PROVIDING FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF AND PENALTIES THEREFROM.

The Council of the Borough of Monroeville does hereby ordain and enact the following Ordinance:

Section 1. That from and after the passage of this Ordinance it shall be unlawful for any vehicle to drive over and upon any street, road, avenue, and thoroughfare of the Borough at a speed in excess of 25 miles per hour.

Section 2. That from and after the passage of this Ordinance it shall be unlawful for any vehicle which shall, together with the freight or carrying load thereon be in excess of 10 ton gross weight, to travel and be operated over and upon any street, road, avenue, or thoroughfare of the Borough of Monroeville.

Section 3. There shall be placed by the Borough appropriate marking signs designating the said speed limit upon the said streets, roads, avenues, and thoroughfares within the Borough.

Section 4. Any person or persons who shall be guilty of operating any vehicle in violation of the speed provisions of this Ordinance shall upon conviction thereof, by summary proceedings, before the Burgess or any Justice of the Peace of the Borough be sentenced to pay a fine of \$10.00 together with costs of prosecution and in default of the payment of said fine and costs, shall be committed to the Allegheny County Jail, for a period of not more than 30 days.

Section 5. Any person or persons who shall be guilty of operating any vehicle in violation of the gross weight provisions of this Ordinance shall upon conviction thereof, by summary proceedings, before the Burgess or any Justice of the Peace of the Borough be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$50.00 together with costs of prosecution, and in default of the payment of said fine and costs, shall be committed to the Allegheny County Jail, for a period of not more than 30 days.

Section 6. Any Ordinances or part of Ordinances conflicting with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed insofar as they shall be in conflict herewith.
