

ORDINANCE NO. 441

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF MONROEVILLE AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CONSTRUCTION AND PAVING OF ELLIOTT ROAD FROM WILLIAM PENN HIGHWAY NORTHWARDLY TO ILLINI DRIVE IN ACCORDANCE WITH PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS PREPARED BY THE BOROUGH OF MONROEVILLE AND PROVIDING FOR THE EXECUTION OF A CONTRACT FOR THE CONSTRUCTION THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED and ENACTED by the Borough of Monroeville, in Council assembled, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by authority of the same:

Section 1. That a section of Elliott Road be reconstructed and paved from William Penn Highway Northwardly to Illini Drive, lying in the Fourth Ward of the Borough of Monroeville, in accordance with plans and specifications of the Borough of Monroeville known as the "Elliott Road Construction Project".

Section 2. Upon the opening of bids for the said project it appeared that the lowest responsible bidder for the construction thereof was Russell Standard Corp., whose gross sum bid was Forty-one Thousand Six Hundred Twenty-three and 60/100 (\$41,623.60) Dollars.

Section 3. The proper officers of the Borough of Monroeville are hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract with Russell Standard Corp. for the construction of the said road project, according to the plans, specifications, conditions and agreements therein contained, as established and approved by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the Borough Engineer of the Borough of Monroeville, for the gross sum of Forty-one Thousand Six Hundred Twenty-three and 60/100 (\$41,623.60) Dollars. The said contract, however, shall be subject to the approval of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Department of Highways.

Section 4. Any ordinance or part of ordinance in conflict with this ordinance is hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
